#### 1. What is PHP?

Answers: PHP is a web language based on scripts that allows developers to dynamically create generated web pages.

PHP is a server side scripting language commonly used for web applications. PHP has many frameworks and cms for creating websites. Even a non technical person can cretae sites using its CMS. WordPress, os Commerce are the famus CMS of php. It is also an object oriented programming language like java, C-sharp etc. It is very eazy for learning

#### 2. What does the initials of PHP stand for?

Answers: PHP means PHP: Hypertext Preprocessor.

#### 3. Which programming language does PHP resemble to?

Answers: PHP syntax resembles Perl and C

#### 4. What does PEAR stands for?

Answers: PEAR means "PHP Extension and Application Repository". it extends PHP and provides a higher level of programming for web developers.

#### 5. What is Open Source Software?

Answers: Software in which the source codes are freely used, modify, and shared by anyone are called Open Source Software. These can also be distributed under licenses that adhere with the Open Source Definition.

6. What is the difference between include(), include\_once() and require\_once() Answers: The include() statement includes and evaluates a specified line i.e. it will include a file based in the given path. require() does the same thing expect upon failure it will generate a fatal error and halt the script whereas include() will just gives a warning and allow script to continue. require\_once() will check if the file already has been included and if so it will not include the file again.

#### 7. Differences between GET, POST and REQUEST methods?

Answers: GET and POST are used to send information from client browser to web server. In case of GET the information is send via GET method in name/value pair and is URL encoded. The default GET has a limit of 512

characters. The POST method transfers the information via HTTP Headers. The POST method does not have any restriction in data size to be sent. POST is used for sending data securely and ASCII and binary type's data. The **\$\_REQUEST** contains the content of both **\$\_GET**, **\$\_POST** and **\$\_COOKIE**.

#### 8. What are the different errors in PHP?

Answers: There are 4 basically types of error.

**Parse Error** – Commonly caused due to syntax mistakes in codes e.g. missing semicolon, mismatch brackets.

**Fatal Error** – These are basically run time errors which are caused when you try to access what can't be done. E.g. accessing a dead object, or trying to use a function that hasn't been declared.

**Warning Error** – These occurs when u try to include a file that is not present, or delete a file that is not on the server. This will not halt the script; it will give the notice and continue with the next line of the script.

**Notice Error** – These errors occurs when u try to use a variable that hasn't been declared, this will not halt the script, It will give the notice and continue with the next line of the script.

#### 9. What is session and why do we use it?

**Answers**: Session is a super global variable that preserve data across subsequent pages. Session uniquely defines each user with a session ID, so it helps making customized web application where user tracking is needed.

#### 10. What is cookie and why do we use it?

**Answers:** Cookie is a small piece of information stored in client browser. It is a technique used to identify a user using the information stored in their browser (if already visited that website). Using PHP we can both set and get COOKIE.

#### 11. How we know the total number of elements of Array?

**Answers:** There are two methods through which we can know the total number of elements:

sizeof(\$array\_var)
count(\$array\_var)

#### 12. What is the difference between explode() and split() functions?

Answers: Split function splits string into array by regular expression. Explode splits a string into array by string.

# 13. How to strip whitespace (or other characters) from the beginning and end of a string?

**Answers:** The trim() function removes whitespaces or other predefined characters from both sides of a string.

#### 14. How to set a page as a home page in a php based site?

Answers: index.php is the default name of the home page in php based sites.

#### 15. How to find the length of a string?

Answers: strlen() function used to find the length of a string.

#### 16. what is the use of isset() in php?

Answers: This function is used to determine if a variable is set and is not NULL.

#### 17. What is the use of "ksort" in php?

Answers: It is used for sort an array by key in reverse order

#### 18. How to delete a file from the system

Answers: Unlink() deletes the given file from the file system

#### 19. What is PEAR in php?

Answers: PEAR(PHP Extension and Application Repository) is a framework and repository for reusable PHP components. PEAR is a code repository containing all kinds of php code snippets and libraries.

PEAR also offers a command-line interface that can be used to automatically install "packages".

\$message vs. \$\$message in PHP.

\$message is a variable with a fixed name. \$\$message is a variable whose name is stored in \$message.

If \$message contains "var", \$\$message is the same as \$var.Echo vs. print statement.

echo() and print() are language constructs in PHP, both are used to output strings. The speed of both statements is almost the same.

echo() can take multiple expressions whereas print cannot take multiple expressions.

Print return true or false based on success or failure whereas echo doesn't return true or false.

#### 20. Explain how to submit form without a submit button.

#### Answers:

We can achieve the above task by using JavaScript code linked to an event trigger of any form field and call the document.form.submit() function in JavaScript code.Explain the different types of errors in PHP.

Notices, Warnings and Fatal errors are the types of errors in PHP

#### **Notices:**

Notices represents non-critical errors, i.e. accessing a variable that has not yet been defined. By default, such errors are not displayed to the user at all but whenever required, you can change this default behavior.

#### Warnings:

Warnings are more serious errors but they do not result in script termination. i.e calling include() a file which does not exist. By default, these errors are displayed to the user

#### **Fatal errors:**

Fatal errors are critical errors i.e. calling a non-existent function or class. These errors cause the immediate termination of the script.

#### 21. What is the use of PEAR in php?

**Answers :** PEAR is known as PHP Extension and Application Repository. It provides structured library to the PHP users and also gives provision for package maintenance.

#### 22. What is the difference between PHP and JavaScript?

Answers: The difference lies with the execution of the languages. PHP is server side scripting language, which means that it can't interact directly with the user. Whereas, JavaScript is client side scripting language, that is used to interact directly with the user.

#### 23. What is the difference between \$message and \$\$message?

Answers: The main difference between \$message and \$\$message is that former one is a simple variable and later is a reference variable. \$message is a variable with a fixed name and it consists of a fixed value. \$\$messages contains the variable itself.

#### 24. What is the use of "echo" in php?

Answers: It is used to print a data in the webpage, Example: <?php echo 'Car insurance'; ?> , The following code print the text in the webpage

#### 25. How to include a file to a php page?

Answers: We can include a file using "include()" or "require()" function with file path as its parameter.

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#### 26. What's the difference between include and require?

Answers: If the file is not found by require(), it will cause a fatal error and halt the execution of the script. If the file is not found by include(), a warning will be issued, but execution will continue.

#### 27. require\_once(), require(), include().What is difference between them?

Answers: require() includes and evaluates a specific file, while require\_once() does that only if it has not been included before (on the same page). So, require\_once() is recommended to use when you want to include a file where you have a lot of functions for example. This way you make sure you don't include the file more times and you will not get the "function re-declared" error.

#### 28. Differences between GET and POST methods?

Answers: We can send 1024 bytes using GET method but POST method can transfer large amount of data and POST is the secure method than GET method.

#### 29. How to declare an array in php?

Answers: Eg: var \$arr = array('apple', 'grape', 'lemon');

#### 30. What is the use of 'print' in php?

Answers: This is not actually a real function, It is a language construct. So you can use with out parentheses with its argument list.

Example print('PHP Interview questions'); print 'Job Interview ');

#### 31. What is use of in array() function in php?

Answers: in\_array used to checks if a value exists in an arraY

#### 32. What is use of count() function in php?

Answers:count() is used to count all elements in an array, or something in an object

#### 33. What's the difference between include and require?

Answers: It's how they handle failures. If the file is not found by require(), it will cause a fatalerror and halt the execution of the script. If the file is not found by include(), a warning will be issued, but execution will continue.

#### 34. What is the difference between Session and Cookie?

Answers: The main difference between sessions and cookies is that sessions are stored on the server, and cookies are stored on the user's computers in the text file format. Cookies can not hold multiple variables, But Session can hold multiple variables. We can set expiry for a cookie, The session only remains active as long as the browser is open. Users do not have access to the data you stored in Session, Since it is stored in the server. Session is mainly used for login/logout purpose while cookies using for user activity tracking

#### 35. How to set cookies in PHP?

Answers: Setcookie("sample", "ram", time()+3600);

#### 36. How to Retrieve a Cookie Value?

Answers: eg: echo \$\_COOKIE["user"];

# 37. How to create a session? How to set a value in session? How to Remove data from a session?

Answers :Create session : session\_start();

Set value into session: \$ SESSION['USER ID']=1;

Remove data from a session : unset(\$ SESSION['USER ID'];

# 38. Is variable name casesensitive? could we start a variale with number like \$4name? What is the difference between \$name and \$\$name?

**Answers**: Yes variable name casesensitive and we can't start a variable with number like \$4name as A valid variable name starts with a letter or underscore, followed by any number of letters, numbers, or underscores.

where as \$\$ is variable of variable \$name is variable where as \$\$name is variable of variable

like \$name=sonia and \$\$name=singh so \$sonia value is singh.

#### 39. How do you connet mysql database with PHP?

Answers: We can connect Mysql Database with PHP using both Procedural and Object oriented style like below

# 40. In how many ways we can retrieve the data in the result set of MySQL using PHP? What is the difference between mysql\_fetch\_object and mysql\_fetch\_array?

Answers: we can retrieve the data in the result set of MySQL using PHP in 4 Ways

- 1. mysqli\_fetch\_row >> Get a result row as an enumerated array
- 2. mysqli\_fetch\_array >> Fetch a result row as associative and numeric array
- 3.mysqli\_fetch\_object >> Returns the current row of a result set as an object
- 4. mysqli\_fetch\_assoc >> Fetch a result row as an associative array mysqli\_fetch\_object() is similar to mysqli\_fetch\_array(), with one difference an object is returned, instead of an array. Indirectly, that means that we can only access the data by the field names, and not by their offsets (numbers are illegal property names).

#### 41. What are the differences between Get and post methods.

Answers: There are some defference between GET and POST method

1. GET Method have some limit like only 2Kb data able to send for request

But in POST method unlimited data can we send 2. when we use GET method requested data show in url but Not in POST method so POST method is good for send sensetive request

#### 43. How can we create a database using PHP and MySQL?

Answers: We can create MySQL database with the use of mysql\_create\_db("Database Name")

#### 44. What are the differences between require and include?

Answers: Both include and require used to include a file but when included file not found

Include send Warning where as Require send Fatal Error.

#### 45. Can we use include ("xyz.PHP") two times in a PHP page "index.PHP"?

Answers: Yes we can use include ("xyz.php") more than one time in any page. but it create a prob when xyz.php file contain some funtions declaration then error will come for already declared function in this file else not a prob like if you want to show same content two time in page then must incude it two time not a prob

# 46. What are the different tables(Engine) present in MySQL, which one is default?

Answers: Following tables (Storage Engine) we can create

- 1. MyISAM(The default storage engine IN MYSQL Each MyISAM table is stored on disk in three files. The files have names that begin with the table name and have an extension to indicate the file type. An .frm file stores the table format. The data file has an .MYD (MYData) extension. The index file has an .MYI (MYIndex) extension.)
- 2. InnoDB(InnoDB is a transaction-safe (ACID compliant) storage engine for MySQL that has commit, rollback, and crash-recovery capabilities to protect user data.)
- 3. Merge
- 4. Heap (MEMORY)(The MEMORY storage engine creates tables with contents that are stored in memory. Formerly, these were known as HEAP tables.

MEMORY is the preferred term, although HEAP remains supported for backward compatibility. )

- 5. BDB (BerkeleyDB)(Sleepycat Software has provided MySQL with the Berkeley DB transactional storage engine. This storage engine typically is called BDB for short. BDB tables may have a greater chance of surviving crashes and are also capable of COMMIT and ROLLBACK operations on transactions) 6. EXAMPLE
- 7. FEDERATED (It is a storage engine that accesses data in tables of remote databases rather than in local tables.)
- 8. ARCHIVE (The ARCHIVE storage engine is used for storing large amounts of data without indexes in a very small footprint.)
- 9. CSV (The CSV storage engine stores data in text files using comma-separated values format.)
- 10. BLACKHOLE (The BLACKHOLE storage engine acts as a "black hole" that accepts data but throws it away and does not store it. Retrievals always return an empty result)

#### 47. What is use of header() function in php?

Answers: The header() function sends a raw HTTP header to a client. We can use herder()

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function for redirection of pages. It is important to notice that header() must be called before any actual output is seen..

#### 48. How can I execute a PHP script using command line?

The dump will contain SQL statements to create the table and/or populate the table. -t, -no-create-info Don't write table creation information (the CREATE TABLE statement). -d, -no-data Don't write any row information for the table. This is very useful if you just want to get a dump of the structure for a table.

# 75. How can I make a script that can be bi-language (supports English, German)?

#### 76. What are the difference between abstract class and interface?

**Answer**: Abstract class: abstract classes are the class where one or moremethods are abstract but not necessarily all method has to be abstract.

Abstract methods are the methods, which are declare in its class but not defined. The definition of those methods must be in its extending class.

*Interface*: Interfaces are one type of class where all the methods are abstract. That means all the methods only declared but not defined. All the methods must be defined by its implemented class.

#### 77. How can we send mail using JavaScript?

**Answer**: JavaScript does not have any networking capabilities as it is designed to work on client site. As a result we can not send mails usingJavaScript. But we can call the client side mail protocol mailtovia JavaScript to prompt for an Email to send. this requires the client to approve it.

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#### 78. How can we repair a MySQL table?

**Answer**: The syntex for repairing a MySQL table is REPAIR TABLENAME, [TABLENAME, ], [Quick], [Extended]. This command will repair the table specified if the quick is given the MySQL will do a repair of only the index tree if the extended is givenit will create index row by row.

#### 79. What are the advantages of stored procedures, triggers, indexes?

Answer: A stored procedure is a set of SQL commands that can be compiled andstored in the server. Once this has been done, clients don't need tokeep reissuing the entire query but can refer to the stored procedure. This provides better overall performance because the query has to be parsed only once, and less information needs to be sent between theserver and the client. You can also raise the conceptual level by having libraries of functions in the server. However, stored procedures of course do increase the load on the database server system, as more of the work is done on the server side and less on the client (application) side. Triggers will also be implemented. A trigger is effectively a type

of stored procedure, one that is invoked when a particular event occurs. For example, you can install a stored procedure that is triggered each time a record is deleted from a transaction table and that stored procedure automatically deletes the corresponding customer from a customer table when all his transactions are deleted. Indexes are used to find rows with specific column values quickly. Without an index, MySQL must begin with the first row and then read through the entire table to find the relevant rows. The larger the table, the more this costs. If the table has an index for the columns in question, MySQL can quickly determine the position to seek to in the middle of the data file without having to look at all the data. If a table has 1,000 rows, this is at least 100 times faster than reading sequentially. If you need to access most of the rows, it is faster to read sequentially, because this minimizes disk seeks.

80. What is the maximum length of a table name, database name and field name in MySQL?

**Answer**: The following table describes the maximum length for each type of identifier.

There are some restrictions on the characters that may appear in identifiers.

81. How many values can the SET function of MySQL take?

**Answer**: MySQL set can take zero or more values but at the maximum it can take 64 values.

#### 87. What is the main difference between PHP 4 and PHP 5?

PHP 5 presents many additional OOP (Object Oriented Programming) features.

#### 88. Is multiple inheritance supported in PHP?

Answers: PHP includes only single inheritance, it means that a class can be extended from only one single class using the keyword 'extended'.

#### 89. What is the meaning of a final class and a final method?

Answers: 'final' is introduced in PHP5. Final class means that this class cannot be extended and a final method cannot be overrided.

#### 90. How comparison of objects is done in PHP5?

Answers: We use the operator '==' to test is two object are instanced from the same class and have same attributes and equal values. We can test if two object are referring to the same instance of the same class by the use of the identity operator '==='.

#### 91. How can PHP and HTML interact?

*Answers*: It is possible to generate HTML through PHP scripts, and it is possible to pass informations from HTML to PHP.

# 92. What type of operation is needed when passing values through a form or an URL?

Answers: If we would like to pass values through a form or an URL then we need to encode and to decode them using htmlspecialchars() and urlencode().

#### 93. How can PHP and Javascript interact?

Answers: PHP and Javascript cannot directly interacts since PHP is a server side language and Javascript is a client side language. However we can exchange

variables since PHP is able to generate Javascript code to be executed by the browser and it is possible to pass specific variables back to PHP via the URL.

#### 94. What is needed to be able to use image function?

Answers: GD library is needed to be able execute image functions.

#### 95. What is the use of the function 'imagetypes()'?

Answers: imagetypes() gives the image format and types supported by the current version of GD-PHP.

- 5. BDB (BerkeleyDB)(Sleepycat Software has provided MySQL with the Berkeley DB transactional storage engine. This storage engine typically is called BDB for short. BDB tables may have a greater chance of surviving crashes and are also capable of COMMIT and ROLLBACK operations on transactions) 6. EXAMPLE
- 7. FEDERATED (It is a storage engine that accesses data in tables of remote databases rather than in local tables.)
- 8. ARCHIVE (The ARCHIVE storage engine is used for storing large amounts of data without indexes in a very small footprint.)
- 9. CSV (The CSV storage engine stores data in text files using comma-separated values format.)
- 10. BLACKHOLE (The BLACKHOLE storage engine acts as a "black hole" that accepts data but throws it away and does not store it. Retrievals always return an empty result)

#### 174. What is Persistent Database Connections?

**Answer:** Persistent connections are links that do not close when the execution of your script ends. When a persistent connection is requested, PHP checks if there's already an identical persistent connection (that remained open from earlier) - and if it exists, it uses it. If it does not exist, it creates the link.

Persistent connections are good if the overhead to create a link to your SQL server is high. Whether or not this overhead is really high depends on many factors. Like, what kind of database it is, whether or not it sits on the same computer on which your web server sits, how loaded the machine the SQL server sits on is and so forth. The bottom line is that if that connection overhead is high, persistent connections help you considerably.

ORM is programming technique for converting data between incompatible type systems in object-oriented programming languages.

Data management tasks in object-oriented programming(OOP) are typically implemented by manipulating objects that are almost always non-scalar values. For example, consider an address book entry that represents a single person along with zero or more phone numbers and zero or more addresses. This could be modeled in an object-oriented implementation by a "Person object" with attributes/fields to hold each data item that the entry comprises: the person's name, a list of phone numbers, and a list of addresses. The list of phone numbers would itself contain "PhoneNumber objects" and so on. The address book entry is treated as a single object by the programming language (it can be referenced by a single variable containing a pointer to the object, for instance)

#### 177. What is Exception Handling in PHP?

**Answer:** Exception Handling is used to handle the error. It can handle all types of error like Warning, Notice, User defined Error message etc but unfortunately it can not handle fatal error, read more...

#### 178. What is dispatcher in Zend?

**Answer:** Dispatching is the process of taking the request object, Zend\_Controller\_Request\_Abstract, extracting the module, controller, action name, and optional parameters contained in it, and then instantiating a controller and calling an action of that controller. If any of the module name, controller name, or action are not found, it will use default values for them.

Zend Controller Dispatcher Standard specifies index for each of the controller and action defaults and default for the module default value, but allows the developer to change the default values for each using the setDefaultController(), setDefaultAction(), and setDefaultModule() methods, respectively.

**Answer:** In Zend Framework, bootstrapping is the process that loads your application. This includes, but is not limited to the Session. Twelve different error types are used to represent these variations internally.

The HTML 2.0 specification says, in section Form Submission (and the HTML 4.0 specification repeats this with minor stylistic changes):

->If the processing of a form is idempotent (i.e. it has no lasting observable effect on the state of the

world), then the form method should be GET. Many database searches have no visible side-effects and make ideal applications of query forms.

->If the service associated with the processing of a form has side effects (for example, modification of a database or subscription to a service), the method should be POST.

#### 234. How the form data is transmitted?

- -> If the method is "get" --, the user agent takes the value of action, appends a ? to it, then appends the form data set, encoded using the application/x-www-form-urlencoded content type. The user agent then traverses the link to this URI. In this scenario, form data are restricted to ASCII codes.
- -> If the method is "post" –, the user agent conducts an HTTP post transaction using the value of the action attribute and a message created according to the content type specified by the enctype attribute.

Answers: Firstly, the the HTTP protocol specifies differing usages for the two methods. GET requests should always be idempotent on the server. This means

\_

that whereas one GET request might (rarely) change some state on the Server, two or more identical requests will have no further effect.

This is a theoretical point which is also good advice in practice. If a user hits "reload" on his/her browser, an identical request will be sent to the server, potentially resulting in two identical database or guestbook entries, counter increments, etc. Browsers may reload a GET URL automatically, particularly if cacheing is disabled (as is usually the case with CGI output), but will typically prompt the user before re-submitting a POST request. This means you're far less likely to get inadvertently-repeated entries from POST.

GET is (in theory) the preferred method for idempotent operations, such as querying a database, though it matters little if you're using a form. There is a further practical constraint that many systems have built-in limits to the length of a GET request they can handle: when the total size of a request (URL+params) approaches or exceeds 1Kb, you are well-advised to use POST in any case.

I would prefer POST when I don't want the status to be change when user resubmits. And GET when it does not matter.

# 236. Who is the father of PHP and explain the changes in PHP versions





modification; objects can easily be modified and added to a system there by reducing maintenance costs. OO programming is also considered to be better at modeling the real world than is procedural programming. It allows for more complicated and flexible interactions. OO systems are also easier for non-technical personnel to understand and easier for them to participate in the maintenance and enhancement of a system because it appeals to natural human cognition patterns. For some systems, an OO approach can speed development time since many objects are standard across systems and can be reused. Components that manage dates, shipping, shopping carts, etc. can be purchased and easily modified for a specific system.

# 257. What are the differences between procedure-oriented languages and object-oriented languages?

**Answer**: Traditional programming has the following characteristics: Functions are written sequentially, so that a change in programming can affect any code that follows it. If a function is used multiple times in a system (i.e., a piece of code that manages the date), it is often simply cut and pasted into each program (i.e., a change log, order function, fulfillment system, etc). If a date change is needed (i.e., Y2K when the code needed to be changed to handle four numerical digits instead of two), all these pieces of code must be found, modified, and tested. Code (sequences of computer instructions) and data (information on which the instructions operates on) are kept separate. Multiple sets of code can access and modify one set of data. One set of code may rely on data in multiple places. Multiple sets of code and data are required to work together. Changes made to any of the code sets and data sets can cause problems through out the system. Object-Oriented programming takes a radically different approach: Code and data are merged into one indivisible item – an object (the term "component" has also been used to describe an object.) An object is an abstraction of a set of real-world things (for example, an object may be created around "date") The object would contain all information and

functionality for that thing (A date object it may contain labels like January, February, Tuesday, Wednesday.

It may contain functionality that manages leap years, determines if it is a business day or a holiday, etc., See Fig. 1). Ideally, information about a particular thing should reside in only one place in a system. The information within an object is encapsulated (or hidden) from the rest of the system. A system is composed of multiple objects (i.e., date function, reports, order processing, etc., See Fig 2). When one object needs information from another object, a request is sent asking for specific information. (for example, a report object may need to know what today's date is and will send a request to the date object) These requests are called

messages and each object has an interface that manages messages. OO programming languages include features such as "class", "instance", "inheritance", and "polymorphism" that increase the power and flexibility of an object.

#### 258. What is the use of friend function?

**Answer**: Sometimes a function is best shared among a number of different classes. Such functions can be declared either as member functions of one class or as global functions. In either case they can be set to be friends of other classes, by using a friend specifier in the class that is admitting them. Such functions can use all attributes of the class which names them as a friend, as if they were themselves members of that class. A friend declaration is essentially a prototype for a member function, but instead of requiring an implementation with the name of that class attached by the double colon syntax, a global function or member function of another class provides the match.

**Answer**: **Public**: Public declared items can be accessed everywhere.

**Protected**: Protected limits access to inherited and parent classes (and to the class that defines the item).

The efficiency of the operating system in handling large numbers of files in a directory can place a practical limit on the number of tables in a database. If the time required to open a file in the directory increases significantly as the number of files increases, database performance can be adversely affected. The amount of available disk space limits the number of tables. MySQL3.22 had a 4GB (4 gigabyte) limit on table size. With the MyISAM storage engine in MySQL 3.23, the maximum table size was increased to 65536 terabytes (2567 – 1 bytes). With this larger allowed table size, the maximum effective table size for MySQL databases is usually determined by operating system constraints on file sizes, not by MySQL internal limits. The InnoDB storage engine maintains InnoDB tables within a table space

that can be created from several files. This allows a table to exceed the maximum individual file size. The table space can include raw disk partitions, which allows extremely large tables. The maximum table space size is 64TB. The following table lists some examples of operating system file-size limits. This is only a rough guide and is not intended to be definitive. We want to ensure that there is no duplication of data in a given row, and that every column stores the least amount of information possible

(making the field atomic). Second Normal Form Where the First Normal Form deals with redundancy of data across a horizontal row, Second Normal Form (or 2NF) deals with redundancy of data in vertical columns. As stated earlier, the normal forms are progressive, so to achieve Second Normal Form, your tables must already be in First NormalForm. Third Normal Form I have a confession to make; I do not often use Third Normal Form. In Third Normal Form we are looking for data in our tables that is not fully dependent on the primary key, but dependent on another value in the table.

Author can not create or control classes of elements to control multiple element types within the document. Selector grouping methods can not be used to create complex element addressing scenarios

In either case they can be set to be friends of other classes, by using a friend specifier in the class that is admitting them. Such functions can use all attributes of the class which names them as a friend, as if they were themselves members of that class.

A friend declaration is essentially a prototype for a member function, but instead of requiring an implementation with the name of that class attached by the double colon syntax, a global function or member function of another class provides the match.

**transient:** A transient variable is a variable that may not be serialized.

**volatile:** a variable that might be concurrently modified by multiple threads should be declared volatile. Variables declared to be volatile will not be optimized by the compiler because their value can change at any time.

#### 292. What are the different types of errors in PHP?

**Answers:** Three are three types of errors:

- **1. Notices:** These are trivial,non-critical errors that PHP encounters while executing a script "for example, accessing a variable that has not yet been defined. By default, such errors are not displayed to the user at all "although, as you will see, you can change this default behavior.
- **2. Warnings:** These are more serious errors "for example, attempting to include() a file which does not exist. By default, these errors are displayed to the user, but they do not result in script termination.
- **3. Fatal errors:** These are critical errors "for example, instantiating an object of a non-existent class, or calling a non-existent function. These errors cause the immediate termination of the script, and PHP's default behavior is to display them to the user when they take place.

CURL allows you to connect and communicate to many different types of servers with many different types of protocols. libcurl currently supports the http, https, ftp, gopher, telnet, dict, file, and ldap protocols. libcurl also supports HTTPS certificates, HTTP POST, HTTP PUT, FTP uploading (this can also be done with PHP <sup>TM</sup>s ftp extension), HTTP form based upload, proxies, cookies, and user+password authentication.

#### **418.** what is PDO?

The PDO (PHP Data Objects) extension defines a lightweight, consistent interface for accessing databases in PHP. if you are using the PDO API, you could switch the database server you used, from say PgSQL to MySQL, and only need to make minor changes to your PHP code.

While PDO has its advantages, such as a clean, simple, portable API but its maindisadvantage is that it doesn't allow you to use all of the advanced features that are available in the latest versions of MySQL server. For example, PDO does not allow you to use MySQL's support for Multiple Statements.

require\_once() and include\_once() are both the functions to include and evaluate the specified file only once. If the specified file is included previous to the present call occurrence, it will not be done again.But require() and include() will do it as many times they are asked to do.

The include\_once() statement includes and evaluates the specified file during the execution of the script. This is a behavior similar to the include() statement, with the only difference being that if the code from a file has already been included, it will not be included again. The major difference between include() and require() is that in failure include() produces a warning message whereas require() produces a fatal errors.

#### 430. What is meant by urlencode and urldecode?

urlencode() returns the URL encoded version of the given string. URL coding converts special characters into % signs followed by two hex digits. For example: urlencode("10.00%") will return "10%2E00%25". URL encoded strings are safe to be used as part of URLs.

urldecode() returns the URL decoded version of the given string.

String urlencode(str) – Returns the URL encoded version of the input string. String values to be used in URL query string need to be URL encoded. In the URL encoded version:

Alphanumeric characters are maintained as is.

Space characters are converted to "+" characters.

Other non-alphanumeric characters are converted "%" followed by two hex digits representing the converted character.

string urldecode(str) – Returns the original string of the input URL encoded string. **For example:**

Once the Web server received the uploaded file, it will call the PHP script specified in the form action attribute to process them. #### 451. What are the advantages of stored procedures, triggers, indexes?

A stored procedure is a set of SQL commands that can be compiled and stored in the server. Once this has been done, clients don't need to keep re-issuing the entire query but can refer to the stored procedure.

This provides better overall performance because the query has to be parsed only once, and less information needs to be sent between the server and the client. You can also raise the conceptual level by having libraries of functions in the server. However, stored procedures of course do increase the load on the database server system, as more of

the work is done on the server side and less on the client (application) side. Triggers will also be implemented. A trigger is effectively a type of stored procedure, one that is invoked when a particular event occurs.

For example, you can install a stored procedure that is triggered each time a record is deleted from a transaction table and that stored procedure automatically deletes the corresponding customer from a customer table when all his transactions are deleted. Indexes are used to find rows with specific column values quickly. Without an index, MySQL must begin with the first row and then read through the entire table to find the relevant rows. The larger the table, the more this costs. If a table has 1,000 rows, this is at least 100 times faster than reading sequentially. If you need to access most of the rows, it is faster to

If the operating system or filesystem places a limit on the number of files in a directory, MySQL is bound by that constraint. The efficiency of the operating system in handling large numbers of files in a directory can place a practical limit on the

number of tables in a database. If the time required to open a file in the directory increases significantly as the number of files increases, database performance can be adversely affected.

The amount of available disk space limits the number of tables.

MySQL 3.22 had a 4GB (4 gigabyte) limit on table size. With the MyISAM storage engine in MySQL 3.23, the maximum table size was increased to 65536 terabytes (2567–1 bytes). With this larger allowed table size, the maximum effective table size for MySQL databases is usually determined by operating system constraints on file sizes, not by MySQL internal limits. The InnoDB storage engine maintains InnoDB tables within a tablespace that can be created from several files. This allows a table to exceed the maximum individual file size. The tablespace can include raw disk partitions, which allows extremely large tables. The maximum tablespace size is 64TB.
